CLINIC LENGTH

Coach Stream*	10 Hours (1 hour On-Ice)	Development 1 *	18 Hours (2 hours On-Ice)
Coach Refresher	Option 1: Classroom only - 4 hrs. Option 2: Hybrid - 3 hrs. in-class + 1 hr. on-ice (4 hrs. total)	Development 2	16 Hours (2 hours On-Ice)

MINIMUM AGE TO ATTEND

A participant must be a minimum of 16 years of age to be certified

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Coach Stream	\$100.00 per participant	Minimum attendance 20/Maximum 40.
Coach Refresher	\$40.00 per participant	Minimum attendance 20/Maximum 40
Development 1	\$120.00 per participant	Minimum attendance 20/Maximum 40.
Development 2	\$300.00 per participant	Minimum attendance 20/Maximum 24.

* All fees includes HST

The Host Centre may increase the Clinic cost to participants to recover the costs incurred in providing facility and equipment. These costs should be built in on a pro rated, per participant basis. Clinics must be operated on a cost-recovery basis and not as a source of revenue generation for the Host Centre. The Host Centre is responsible for the collection of all registration fees from participants, and paying all incidental costs.

Canadian Hockey Initiation Program (CHIP) Intro Coach (CHIP) Clinic Fact Sheet

CLINIC LENGTH

The Intro Coach (CHIP) clinic is 6 hours in length and includes 1.5 hours of ice

MINIMUM AGE TO ATTEND

Participants must be a minimum of 14 years of age to attend the clinic. Participants aged below 16 will be identified with 'Associate Status' until they reach the age of 16. These young people serve as assistants to more experienced Initiation Program Instructors in the program

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

\$60.00 per participant (Includes HST); Minimum attendance 25 / Maximum 40

The Host Centre may increase cost to participants to recover presentation costs. Workshops must be operated on a cost-recovery basis

INITIATION PROGRAMMING INFORMATION

Association Initiation Program Certification

Associations implementing the Initiation Program are eligible for OMHA Certification. Certification consists of completing an IP Questionnaire, as well as observation/monitoring by an OMHA designated IP representative to ensure the Association is adhering to the program implementation guidelines and philosophy. IP-Certified Associations receive a banner suitable for display in your local arena.

Initiation Program Fun Festivals

The IP Festival concept is designed to provide a venue to focus initial exposure to hockey for all participants: players, parents and family, administrators, and Associations. It also serves as a showcase for your Association in the community. The IP Festival is designed to be a comprehensive program, offering both on-ice and off-ice sessions for all participants.

INTRO COACH (CHIP) ASSOCIATE STATUS – RATIONALE

The intent of this 'Associate' status provides an opportunity and encouragement to young potential future coaches to gain experience in assisting experienced IP Instructors. This enables these young people to serve as assistants and contribute toward the implementation and delivery of the IP in their Local Association while at the same time enhancing their personal development under the guidance of experienced IP Instructors. Much like the IP itself for players it is hoped that this will serve as a formative initiation to coaching.
